#### REFLECTIONS FROM THE PULPIT

#### 3 Lessons I Learned from Hearing Confessions

As an Orthodox Priest, I am privy to the intimate details of a person's heart.

Over the several years it has been sobering to listen to the pain and anxiety that everyone goes through.

The betrayals and the disappointments. The grief and the bitterness.

Their sins remind me of my sins. They remind me of my own need for confession.

And so, over the course of the years that I have been listening to confession, and the decades I have been going to confession, I want to share these three lessons with you. I think you will find them valuable as well.

#### Lesson #1 - Your Trauma Is Not Unique

If you've suffered pain and trauma, there's a lie you are tempted to tell yourself, "No one has ever suffered like me."

When you accept this lie, your trauma and sin become a wall that separates you from other people. You feel alone. And this breeds self-loathing and despair. You define your life by this one event or sin. And feeling lonely confirms the lie you tell yourself.

Trauma grows in loneliness but is healed in community.

Your trauma is not unique. You are not the first person to go through this pain. When you accept this you can begin the journey towards healing. You look for others who have suffered in the same or similar ways. Find a support group and immerse yourself in community. There you will find healing.

Confessing your pain is the first step towards entering into community.

#### Lesson #2 - Your Sin Is Like A Cancer

Think of your sin like a spiritual cancer.

Cancer can wreck havoc in your body for years before it is detected. You usually go in because of unrelated symptoms and then find a much deeper root cause. If it remains untreated it can lead to death. The best ways to catch cancer is by doing a yearly check-up with a doctor and by being self-attentive to any symptoms that may come up.

If caught, cancer treatments vary depending on the type of cancer. Some treatments are uncomfortable while other treatments deteriorate your body.

This is exactly what sin is like.

Sin is the cancer of the soul.

Sin remains undetected at first. It

slowly spreads to other spiritual organs; the heart, the eyes, or the mind. Sin taints everything it touches. And as it continues to grow symptoms will develop overtime.

If sin taints your eyes, you begin to watch more filthy images.

If sin taints your heart, you begin to see everything as evil and corrupted.

If sin taints your mind, you begin to cultivate insidious thoughts.

The priest is like a doctor and confession like your yearly check-up. You begin to treat your sin like cancer. Being self-attentive, you make an account of the various symptoms (small sins) that have accumulated since your last check-up. The doctor (the priest) then prescribes various treatments (the ascetical practices of the Church) depending on the type of cancer (passion).

When you understand sin as a cancer, you begin to actively live a healthy spiritual life that keeps spiritual cancer at bay.

#### Lesson #3 - You Are Lacking Healthy Shame

You and I (and society) need more healthy shame.

Healthy shame is like the signpost on the fence that reads "Beware of dog." This type of shame is a limit imposed on the soul. It signals to you, "You probably shouldn't be doing this because others are watching and there are consequences." You likely experienced this shame as a child. It stopped you from doing some stupid stuff.

I see healthy shame lacking in confessions.

Next time you go to confession, notice how you speak about your sins. There are

some sins that you feel ashamed about. These sins you often beat around the bush. You make excuses or justifications. You are ashamed to say the sin simply for what it is.

Other much worse sins you gloss over without a second thought. As though it were no big deal. I sense no shame in those sins.

Healthy shame orders your life properly.

Normally you feel bold when committing a sin and then shame when you go to confess it. But really, it should be the other way around. You should feel shame when committing a sin and bold when you confess it.

This is healthy shame at work.

This is how we grow spiritually.

The goal is "to make us ashamed where we ought to be but aren't; to make us free of shame where we are ashamed but shouldn't be; to make us exactly as ashamed as we ought to be, no more and no less, in all areas." (Quote from The Ethics of Beauty by Dr. Timothy Patitsas)

Learn to cultivate healthy shame in your life.

Integrating these lessons in your own life takes time.

I have learned that integrating these lessons in my own life has resolved a lot of my internal anguish. There is no longer this rush to solve every problem. It stops being less about me and more about Christ.

For God is working in the areas where I find myself lacking.

#### **AHEPA Marathon Chapter Announces Scholarship Awards**

The Order of AHEPA Marathon Chapter #2 proudly awarded \$36,250 in scholarships to 17 college and high school students during a ceremony on Sunday, May 19 at Holy Trinity Cathedral. George Zogzas, Scholarship Committee Chairman, presented the awards.

AHEPA, the American Hellenic Educational



Progressive Association, was established in July 1922 in Atlanta, GA, with a mission to champion civil rights and combat discrimination, bigotry, and hatred. Emphasizing ancient Hellenic ideals, A HEPA promotes education, philanthropy, civic responsibility, and individual excellence

through community service and volunteerism. Marathon Chapter No. 2 was founded in Charlotte just two months later, in September 1922.

This year, the Scholarship Committee had the privilege of awarding two new named scholarships. The Pappas Family Foundation, led by Peter and Ellen "Sissy" Pappas, funded a \$5,000 scholarship in memory of their late father, Thomas P. Pappas, a longtime active member and former President of the Marathon Chapter. The second \$5,000 scholarship was named in honor of Khalil "Kal" Kardous, also a former Chapter President. Funds for this scholarship were raised by Kal's Pals through two events: a Cigar Night at LoSo Tavern on April 16 and a two-day document shredding event at Holy Trinity on April 19 and 20.

The local chapter also offers merit scholarships to qualified children and grandchildren of active members. Below are the names of this year's scholarship recipients, with named scholarships awarded to those with the highest overall scores.

#### **Seniors Graduation**

On May 19, 2024, the Senior Sunday school graduates donned their respective caps and gowns in school colors and proceeded down the middle aisle as their names were read.

The program began with opening remarks from John Shelton. He began by reading "A Graduate's Prayer" by Helen Steiner Rice. He reminded them of their focus this year, putting God first in everything they do including their finances and their relationships. And that, even though they are all headed to college and some of them may not return to Holy Trinity, it will always be their home.

Father Jonathan followed with his own congratulations, then asked if they know what a vocation is. He explained that vocation does not just mean a trade, or learning a trade, it means a calling. He continued that if we have a vocation, there must be a caller. "Who do we suppose the caller is" he asked the seniors, then pointed skyward to give them a hint. "It is God, God is the caller" he continued stressing that even though the graduates are headed in different directions, they, and we, share a common vocation. "Our vocation is to love God with all our heart, with all our might, with all our soul, with all our strength, and our neighbor as yourself."

Members of the class then spoke from the pulpit, First Alex Phillips, who served as co-President of GOYA addressed his classmates and the congregation. His very personal recounting of his own young life filled with physical and spiritual lows that, through persistence and determination, he was able to find his balance and lift himself to the highs of a true communion with God's grace.

He was followed by fellow GOYA co-President, Nicole Vastis. Her remarks began with "I am thankful for Holy Trinity in all it is: a hospital for the soul, a school for the wise, a basketball court for the 8th graders, and a ship steering us all to the gates of Heaven one day. It is a place of communion between us and God, but also communion between each other. Its stained glass windows and tile floors raised me as much as my own parents did."

Those remarks were followed by two special presentations. First, Mrs. Georgia Andrews presented the Presbytera Kathryn Tuntas Constantinides Scholarship to Ms. Meredith Boukidis

Next, John Shelton announced the #doyourbestgiveGODtherest award. The award recognizes a Holy Trinity senior for their involvement in our GOYA and youth programs. This year's winner was Ms. Nikki Blathras.

Sarah Vastis, Director of Youth Ministries, then presented the certificates and gifts to each of the graduates. Father Jonathan assisted in passing out the gifts as John Shelton called each graduate by name.

The ceremony finished after Senior Arianna Kefalas gave the closing prayer. 

Our Chapter made heartwarming visits to bring gift bags of Easter joy to 36 members of our homebound community. The visits are a reminder of how compassion and community connects us all.







#### HOLY TRINITY GREEK ORTHODOX FOUNDATION ANNUAL REPORT

To Holy Trinity Community:

The Foundation is pleased to report that 2023 was another productive year. We held eight meetings with 90% attendance in 2023.

Financial results show the approximate value of assets at the end of the year was just under \$1.7 million, up 8% from the end of 2022. Restricted funds of \$1,248,507 represent the total of all memorials, donations, and bequests received since 1973. While restricted funds cannot be spent, they are invested to earn income that can be distributed. Revenues totaled \$105,337 in 2023 comprised of \$63,235 in dividends & interest and \$42,102 in memorials and donations received. Grants and donations made totaled \$41,500 (details below), or approximately 2.4% of average assets.

On **Sunday, February 5, 2023**, we held our annual Memorial Sunday which included the reading of the names of family and friends remembered through donations to the Foundation. Afterwards, we hosted a luncheon for the community celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Foundation's establishment in 1973. A permanent reminder of that date was achieved with the placement of two plaques with the Foundation's mission along with the names of the first Trustees and witnesses.

Our thanks to outgoing Trustees Nick Kallelis and George Watson, III. We welcome newcomers George Copsis and Tommy Skenteris.




